Over the summer SGVDS participated in the Chris Holden, California State Assemblyman, Pasadena Block party for our community. We were happy to assist our community with offering information about dental care services, children and geriatric oral health. Thank you to Dr. Donna Arase (Community Health Chair) and Dr. Marvin Carnow for making SGVDS's community outreach a success!

Here are a few updates from CDA Executive Director, Peter DuBois:

Legislative Updates: Governor Brown has signed SB 1245 (Lieu) which will extend the Dental Hygiene Committee of California in its current form for another four years, and AB 357 (Pan), which converts the Healthy Families Advisory Panel to the Medi-Cal Children's Health Advisory Panel. Governor Brown has signed AB 1962 (Skinner-MLR for Dental Plans) into law. This is a major victory for CDA members and their patients, as AB1962 will bring increased accountability and transparency to dental insurance plans in California. The bill establishes standardized requirements for dental plans to annually disclose how they spend patient premium dollars and states the Legislature's intent to adopt, by 2018, a minimum percentage of patient premium revenue that dental plans must spend directly on patient care as opposed to profits and overhead. The governor also signed AB 1174 (Bocanegegra-Virtual Dental Home) into law. AB1174 will help reduce barriers to oral health care by using tele-health technology under the diagnosis and direction of a dentist.

No on 46 gains Support:

CDA plans to send a letter to all CDA members urging them to vote "no" on Proposition 46. Proposition 46. Proposition 46 is a measure sponsored by trial attorneys that would quadruple the noneconomic damages cap under California's Medical Injury Compensation Reform Act (MICRA) from \$250,000 to \$1.1 million, plus annual inflation adjustments. This would have a harmful impact on our health care system, including significantly higher liability insurance costs and health care costs. Under MICRA, Californians already have the right to unlimited economic damages, which include past/future medical expenses, past/future lost wages, and have the right to unlimited punitive damages. Four major California newspapers have joined the growing list of opponents to Proposition 46. The San Diego Union Tribune, the San Francisco Chronicle, San Jose Mercury News and Sacramento Bee, have urged their readers to vote "No" on the ballot measure that would raise the non-economic damages cap on MICRA. The "No on 46" coalition has grown to more than 600 organizations.

SGVDS has free campaign materials including lawn signs, brochures, posters and buttons available to help you inform your colleagues and patients.

# TAX CORNER

#### **Using Section 529 Plan as Part of Estate Planning**

Section 529 of the Internal Revenue Code is an education savings plan operated by a state or educational institution granting special tax privileges for families to set aside funds for future college costs.

Your contributions are not deductible on your federal tax return but your investment growth is tax-deferred.

A grandparent isn't required to be the account owner of his or her grandchild's 529 plan. Should the grandparent own the plan, the Medicaid eligibility will be factored in unless the funds are specifically exempted from state law.

A grandparent, as an account owner does not influence the federal government aid application (FAFSA). By contrast, a parent-owned 529 plan is reported as an asset, a 5.6 percent reduction of the account balance in financial aid.



Distributions to pay for the beneficiary's qualified higher-education expenses are tax free. The expenses are tuition, fees, supplies, room and board (for students who are at least half-time), books, and equipment required for attendance at any accredited college in the United States or abroad.

Withdrawals not used for qualified higher-education expenses (called a nonqualified distribution) will face a double consequence:

- 1. The earnings portion is subject to a 10% penalty.
- 2. The earnings portion is taxed at the recipient's (the person who receives the distribution, the account owner or the beneficiary) rate.

Alternatively, the account owner can change the account beneficiary to another qualifying member.

There are two types of Sec 529 plans:

- 1. Prepaid tuition programs.
- 2. Higher-education savings accounts

Currently, all fifty states have at least one 529 plan available. States can sponsor the prepaid tuition programs or the higher-education savings account.

All contributions to a 529 plan qualify for the annual federal gift tax exclusion. A special election for gifts up to \$70,000 (\$140,000 for joint gifts) can be made at one time to a beneficiary's account as if it has been made ratably over a five-year period.

Should the account owner die before the end of the five-year period, the portion of the contributions allocated to the years after your death will be brought back to the estate for tax purposes.

The 529 account can continue under a new account owner. It is advisable to name a successor owner otherwise it will be designated through probate. As the costs of a college education continue to climb, a comparison and evaluation of different plans are needed.

Dear Members of SGVDS.



# Hydrocodone drugs reclassified

Despite concerns expressed by the ADA and other stakeholders, the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) has finalized a rule to classify hydrocodone combination products such as Vicodin and Norco as Schedule II drugs instead of Schedule III.

The reclassification, effective Oct. 6, will impact dentists with a Schedule III DEA registration because they will have to reregister with the DEA for Schedule II authority to continue prescribing/refilling certain pain-relieving medications for their patients. The DEA is permitting hydrocodone combination products prescriptions issued before Oct. 6 to be refilled until April 8, 2015, if the prescription authorizes refills.


The DEA's ruling stems from a U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) recommendation that hydrocodone combination products be put into a more restrictive classification and schedule, with the goal being to boost control over prescriptions from dentists and physicians.

"... in recent years, the FDA has become increasingly concerned about the abuse and misuse of opioid products, which have sadly reached epidemic proportions in certain parts of the United States. While the value of and access to these drugs has been a consistent source of public debate, the FDA has been challenged with determining how to balance the need to ensure continued access to those patients who rely on continuous pain relief while addressing the ongoing concerns about abuse and misuse," the FDA said in a statement. In California, more than 1 billion dosage units of hydrocodone combination products were dispensed last fiscal year, according to CURES.

# When Is Too Much Really Too Much?

The practicing dentist is under pressure from a variety of sources. Among these, financial pressures can be unrelenting, compelling a dentist to look for ways to increase revenue. Despite these pressures however, it is critical that treatment planning always be in the best interest of the patient.

In these situations, it is helpful to look at our codes of ethics for guidance. Section 1 of the CDA Code of Ethics states "Service to the public is the primary obligation of the dentist as a professional person. Service to the public includes the delivery of quality, competent, and timely care within the bounds of the clinical circumstances presented by the patient." The ADA Principles of Ethics and Code of Professional Conduct (ADA Code) also offers assistance in resolving this dilemma. The Preamble to the ADA Code states that the ADA "calls upon dentists to follow high ethical standards which have the benefit of the patient as their primary goal."

We see in addition, in Section 5.B.6 of the ADA Code, that "A dentist who performs unnecessary dental services or procedures is engaged in unethical conduct." Of course, one of the challenges lies in how we define unnecessary or excessive treatment. An effective litmus test may be to ask "Who will benefit more from the proposed treatment: the patient or me?"

It is also important to consider the ethical principles involved. Autonomy is paramount in our dealings with patients. Obtaining informed consent from your patient shows respect for their autonomy. This must be balanced with our paternalistic tendencies (trust me, I'm the doctor). Ethically, our authority as the doctor should not be used to achieve selfish ends.

Beneficence and its corollary principle non-maleficence are also important principles to consider. "Will the proposed treatment irreparably damage healthy tooth structure?" is a question that could be asked. Justice and integrity also come into play. We should affirm doing the right thing even when outside interests are in conflict with our values and conscience.

Dentists should avoid recommending treatment "upgrades" in order to maximize profits that may be limited because of third party restrictions. Employee dentists should be wary of compulsion to meet high production quotas by performing treatment that may not be in the patient's best interest. Ultimately, it is your license on the line. You must determine what is right.
